

Paris – The Capital of International Arbitration

All you need to know about Paris, the ICC and the advantages of arbitration proceedings in France

Nadia Darwazeh

Paris has always enjoyed an outstanding reputation as a location for the seat of international arbitration proceedings. In many ways, Paris is the capital of international arbitration because the city offers a multitude of advantages as a place of arbitration.

The ICC, the leading international arbitral institution, is based in Paris

Paris' long-standing reputation as a centre of arbitration is closely intertwined with the fact that the global headquarters of the International Chamber of Commerce (ICC) and its Court of International Arbitration are located in the heart of the city and have been ever since its establishment in 1923.

It is fair to say that the ICC is the leading international arbitral institution having administered to date more than 25,000 arbitrations around the world. In 2019, ICC arbitrations were seated in more than 110 cities in over 60 countries across the globe, with the most popular seats being Paris, London, Geneva and Singapore.

The fact that Paris has established itself as a major arbitral seat is no doubt due in part to the ICC's radiance as well as the ICC's continuous striving to stay on the cusp of innovation, as evidenced most recently by the 2012 ICC Rules of Arbitration. It was also the ICC that provided the United Nations with the first draft of what became perhaps the most successful and widely used international convention, namely the New York Convention on the Recognition and Enforcement of Foreign Arbitral Awards 1958 (more commonly known as just the "New York Convention") over 60 years ago. This convention, to which 168 countries have since acceded, is of paramount importance for international arbitration as it provides a strong legal framework for the recognition and enforcement of arbitral awards around the world. Unsurprisingly, France was one of the inaugural countries that signed the New York Convention back in 1958. Indeed, Paris is also a preferred seat of arbitration because France is a country that has historically been and continues to be very much pro-arbitration.

French law strongly favors arbitration

Paris has long been recognized as an impartial and neutral jurisdiction within which to conduct arbitrations due to the fact that both French laws and courts are supportive of arbitration. Similar to Germany, France has codified these laws in its Code de procédure civile (Code of Civil Procedure). The provisions of the French Code of Civil Procedure dealing with arbitration, which date back to 1981, were revised in 2011 (the "2011 law") in order to codify the well-established



French case law developed over the past thirty years and to introduce a number of innovations.

Autonomy of the arbitration agreement

As a starting point, the 2011 law confirms the long-established principle of the autonomy of the arbitration agreement, whereby the arbitration agreement is deemed to be independent from the contract itself (Article 1447). Therefore, the arbitration clause is severable from the main contract, allowing an arbitration to proceed even if the contract is purportedly or actually invalid. Moreover, unlike many other jurisdictions, the agreement to arbitrate is not subject to any formal requirements (Article 1507), thus permitting parties to arbitrate with more ease and ultimately providing them with security that the clause detailing their agreement to arbitrate will be enforced. French law also established the principle of "competence-competence" very early on, pursuant to which the arbitral tribunal has the power to determine whether it has jurisdiction under an arbitration clause. Apart from these "bells and whistles" provisions that one would expect to see today in any modern arbitration law, the 2011 law introduced a number of innovative features, a few of which are discussed below.

Independence of the arbitral process

The 2011 law also confirms the independence of the arbitral process from the influence of the French courts and actually encourages the courts to take measures to aid arbitral proceedings. In fact, the new law goes so far as to refer to the relevant court judge merely as a "supporting judge" (juge d'appui), thereby reflecting the well-established French tradition that judges shall not unduly interfere in the arbitral process. Rather, French judges view their role as one of supporting the arbitral process.

In the same vein and in line with only a handful of other jurisdictions, the 2011 law grants parties the novel option of waiving their right to set aside an award (Article 1522). Indeed, while state courts may not review an award on the merits, a party may apply to have the award annulled at the seat of arbitration based on certain procedural grounds (Article 1520). This review is referred to as set-aside proceedings and the grounds for doing so in France are limited to serious procedural irregularities, as is the case in other jurisdictions. However, by providing parties with the ability to waive their right to annulment proceedings, French law allows them to further insulate the award from the state courts.

Efficiency of enforcement

The 2011 law has also further increases the efficiency of the enforcement of an award. Indeed, awards rendered in France are now directly enforceable even if set-aside proceedings are pending (Article 1526). Before 2011, one was not able to seek enforcement of an award until set-aside proceedings had been concluded. Accordingly, parties who were unsuccessful when the award was rendered could use such set-aside proceedings as a tactic to delay enforcement, even if they had no chance of getting the award set aside. The 2011 law therefore now dissuades parties from frivolously applying to set aside an award because even if such proceedings are initiated, enforcement measures will continue to run their course.

In addition to these innovative features, it is important to remember that the choice of Paris as a seat of arbitration does not equate with the use of French language or French law in the arbitration. Indeed, even though Paris is consistently the number one seat chosen in ICC arbitrations, in 2019, 79% of approved awards were rendered in English, 7% in French and 1% in German. By the same token, 16% were governed by English law and 10% were governed by French law. Furthermore, if the parties choose Paris as the seat of arbitration, they can of course agree to hold the hearings anywhere else that is most convenient to them.

French courts have a reliable pro-arbitration track record

As those familiar with arbitration will know, in order to provide for a good seat of arbitration, a modern arbitration law is only one piece of the puzzle. The other equally important piece is state courts at the seat that apply the arbitration law properly, meaning they refrain from interfering with the arbitration process and instead support it.

France's court system provides for a neutral and impartial jurisdiction with specialized courts accustomed to dealing with issues arising out of arbitrations at all stages of the proceedings

A number of renowned French court decisions illustrate particularly well how supportive the French courts are of arbitration. For example, in the Dallah v. Pakistan case, unlike the United Kingdom Supreme Court, the Paris Court of Appeals (Cour d'appel) gave full effect to the underlying arbitration agreement (in the UK: [2010] UKSC 46; in France: docket No 09/28533). In this case, an arbitral tribunal sitting in Paris rendered an award against the respondent, the government of Pakistan. The claimant brought enforcement proceedings in England to enforce the award, which Pakistan sought to resist. The English courts applied French law and ruled that contrary to the Tribunal's decision Pakistan was not bound by the arbitration clause because the actual signatory of the agreement was a trust created by the Ministry of Religious Affairs. Accordingly, the English courts refused to enforce the award. At the same time, Pakistan had applied to the French courts to have the Paris-seated award set aside. The Paris Court of Appeals, which was confronted with the same question, namely whether Pakistan was bound by the arbitration clause as a matter of French law, reached the opposite conclusion to that of the English courts. The French court ruled that Pakistan was bound by the arbitration clause by virtue of its actions both before and after the contract was concluded. 10 years later, in the case of Kabab-ji v Kout Food Group, a similar saga unfolded with the French courts upholding the award and the English courts refusing to do so. The French court's decision in Dallah and in Kabab-ji are good examples of the courts' more liberal approach to upholding arbitration clauses.

Paris offers a plethora of practical advantages

Finally, there are also numerous practical considerations that combine to make Paris an excellent choice for the seat of arbitration. It has top-notch lawyers that are experts in the field, offers a central location in Europe and has excellent transportation connections. It also offers numerous facilities for conducting arbitrations including the ICC Hearing Centre founded in 2008, and the European headquarters of the World Bank for investor-state arbitrations administered under the rules of the international centre for the settlement of investment disputes (ICSID).

Last but not least, apart from the favorable legal framework for international arbitrations that Paris offers, choosing Paris also has the benefit that once a long day of meetings or hearings is over, one can enjoy an apéritif at one of Paris' quintessential sidewalk cafés and hopefully close off a successful day with a memorable dinner at one of the many fine Parisian restaurants.

Dispute Resolution in Digital Age

Introduction

Arbitration benefits from a great increase in the use of technology which has directly effected the conduct of proceedings. More particularly, with the digitalization, the way that we conduct arbitration proceedings has been changed to reflect the current needs of parties with an aim of increasing time and cost efficiency. In this line and a measure against the COVID-19 pandemic, virtual hearings have become common.

The general awareness of the environmental issues has also been a subject matter discussed in the legal industry. There have been global initiatives such as the signing of the Paris Agreement on climate change as well as trends to reduce carbon footprints and green pledges.

Accordingly, this article firstly deals with (i) virtual hearings (ii) electronic submissions and (iii) the green pledge.

Virtual Hearings

COVID-19 caused arbitrators, parties, arbitral institutions, and all participants to adapt to new conditions. Virtual hearings are among the tools participants discovered throughout the pandemic. We have experienced different approaches from various institutions, whereas some canceled or delayed hearings and some such as the International Chamber of Commerce ("ICC") adapted very rapidly and published guidelines on the effects of COVID-19 and virtual hearings to assist its users.

Guidance Note on Possible Measures Aimed at Mitigating the Effects of the COVID-19 Pandemic ("ICC Guidance") is a good example. Besides the ICC Guidance, another important tool is the Seoul Protocol on Video Conferencing in International Arbitrations that provides useful recommendations mainly on documents, venue, witnesses, observers, technical issues, interpretation, and recording. American Arbitration Association ("AAA") also published virtual hearing guides, orders, and procedures.

ICC Guidance is not only related to virtual hearings but rather covers a wide range of issues. What comes across interesting in 2020 is that, the ICC regulated virtual hearings explicitly in its 2021 Arbitration Rules. Even though this revision is not made as a result of the effects of COVID-19 the timing of the 2021 ICC Rules of Arbitration very well fitted with the needs of the practitioners. Even before the revision, the wide discretion given by the ICC to the arbitral tribunals allowed the conduct of virtual hearings. Currently, this issue is regulated explicitly in Article 26 of the 2021 ICC Rules of Arbitration,



which states that hearings can be conducted remotely by videoconference, telephone, or other appropriate means of communication.

ICC Guidance provides tips to the users by focusing on cost and time-effective measures. It recommends procedural considerations to ensure due process. There are certain issues an arbitral tribunal should consider; type of the hearing, time zones, travel barriers, duration of the hearing, number of parties/experts/witnesses, recording, interpretation, the procedure for taking evidence, and electronic hearing bundle are some of them. ICC Guidance further recommends parties to agree on a cyber protocol and lists suggested provisions. This is an important document and a tool that parties should consider to comply with, which deals with isssues such as data privacy rules and ensuring cybersecurity.

There is no doubt that one of the biggest advantages of virtual hearings is the reduction of costs. One of the major drawbacks of arbitration is the costs associated with it and thus is a very sensitive issue. Accordingly attention must be paid by arbitral tribunals while deciding on procedural considerations.

Another important consideration is the enforceability of the award. In this respect, it should always be kept in mind that having a virtual hearing should never be an obstacle before the enforcement of the award. This issue can arise especially if parties do not want to hold a virtual hearing or one of them does not and an arbitral tribunal decides to do so. An arbitral tribunal can decide to hold a virtual hearing even if the parties do not agree, in this case, the arbitral tribunal when

making a decision should consider the circumstances and make sure equality of the parties and due process is ensured.

There are benefits of virtual hearings but these do not come without concerns. It is fair to say that overall experience is very positive and the demand for conducting virtual hearings is increasing. All participants have learned from the procedural deficiencies and have gained experience. Major concerns that capture attention are ensuring due process, difficulty in giving oral submissions and cross-examining witnesses, cybersecurity, and data protection.

Due process is a concern as it can be more difficult to ensure equality between the parties. For example, if an arbitrator does not pay attention to the time zones of the parties it risks creating a privilege to one of them. Therefore utmost diligence should be paid to every detail. Practitioners are also adapting and learning new techniques for giving oral submissions and cross-examination. With the decrease use of gestures and eye contact, the sequence of questions directed to witnesses as well as the usage of demonstrative exhibits will play an important role in virtual hearings. The technical infrastructure is also vital, slow internet connection or lack of technical support may result in due process concerns. Experience shows that parties may be inclined to and suggest turning off their cameras during the hearing because of slow internet connection which raises questions as to the identification of the person testifying. With experience and more detailed regulations, guidelines, notes published by arbitral institutions procedural obstacles may be overcome and the conduct of efficient virtual hearings will undoubtedly increase.

Electronic Submissions

It is safe to say that digitalization of arbitration and the use of Information Technology (IT) solutions shall inevitably contribute to a greener arbitration. A report dealing with Information Technology in International Arbitration prepared by the ICC Commission on Arbitration and ADR, dated 2017, shows that, IT solutions were not widely used in international arbitration. However, that does not mean there are no efforts to increase the use of IT solutions. Within this context, document management systems are worth mentioning. These platforms encourage parties to refrain from printing all sorts of documents. With the increase use of technology, online bundles have become more popular as well.

A good example of document management systems is the NetCase platform which is a document management platform that allowed parties to electronically follow the course of the arbitration. The NetCase was presented by the ICC as early as 2005 but has been abondened. The ICC has also announced that parties will be able to rely on fully digitalised services through a new case management platform, which will allow documents such as terms of references and awards to be concluded electronically. This will also allow parties to be notified electronically.

Currently, there are other arbitral institutions that offer such systems such as the AAA, World Intellectual Property Organizastion and Stockhol Chamber of Commerce. These systems also provide for more efficient and cost-effective arbitral proceedings. It is also noteworthy that, many institutions including the ICC have allowed electronic submissions during the COVID-19 pandemic as also provided under the ICC Guidance.

Similar to other institutions, under the ICC Rules of Arbitration, arbitral tribunals have the power to decide whether or not to order

the production of documentary evidence, including electronic documents, and to manage any such process in a fair and efficient way. The ICC Arbitration Commission Report on Managing E-Document Production is also worth reviewing by practitioners. Arbitral tribunals consider various issues when making orders related to production of documents, and it is safe to say that these days, more environmentally friendly choices are being made by arbitral tribunals

As a result of concerns such as cybersecurity, data security, drafting procedural orders related to usage of platforms, a working group including practitioners from different law firms was established. Such working group prepared the Protocol for Online Case Management in International Arbitration ("Protocol"). This Protocol seeks to deliver a globally consistent approach to the use of online case management platforms in international arbitration.

Apart from these platforms arbitral institutions offer, there are various programs available that may be used by practitioners. The International Bar Association ("IBA") provides guidance related to these platforms. As stated by the IBA, there are platforms which allow to host, manage, organise, sort, and transfer voluminous documents and submissions gathered and/or exchanged in an arbitration.

The Green Pledge

It is clear that, the awareness of environmental issues including the reduction of carbon footprints has increased recently. This increase of awareness can be classified as a global trend that includes not only efforts from the legal industry but from various other industries. The efforts to make arbitration more environmentally friendly includes the green pledge ("Green Pledge").

The Green Pledge seeks to raise awareness of the significant carbon footprint of the arbitration community and aims to encourage all arbitration practitioners to commit to the Campaign's (the Campaign for Greener Arbitrations) Guiding Principles and reduce their carbon emissions. The Guiding Principles set out examples that may be easily implemented by practitioners. These include creating a work space with a reduced environmental footprint by looking for opportunities to reduce energy consumption and waste, corresponding electronically, unless hard copy correspondence is expressly needed in the circumstances, while also being mindful that email has a carbon footprint requesting the use of electronic rather than hard copies of documents and promoting the use of electronic bundles at hearings, and using, suppliers and service providers who are committed to reducing their environmental footprint (including for the purposes of arranging an arbitration hearing). The Guiding Principles also mention the use of videoconferencing facilities as an alternative to travel which includes holding virtual hearings rather than in person hearings, a topic dealt with above.

A similar approach is seen in mediation. The Mediators Green Pledge was launched in October 2020 which was inspired by the Campaign for Greener Arbitrations and the Green Pledge.

Conclusion

The digitalisation of arbitration is expected to result in reduced costs, reduced carbon footprint, and increase the efficiency of the proceedings. Virtual hearings, electronic submissions, document management systems, and the platforms established by the arbitral institutions will play a vital role in reaching such expectations.
